



Intellectual Property

Use the Internet to find information you need for a report. If you find information you want to use, remember that **it is your responsibility** to do the following before you leave the Web site:

- Copy the URL of any Web site you use. A URL is found near the top of a Web page and looks like <http://www.isafe.org>.
- Write down the title of the article.
- Write down the author—the person who wrote the information or the group that sponsors the Web site.
- Write down the date the Web page was made. It's usually at the bottom of the page.
- List any Web site you use at the end of your report.



Here's an example:

i-SAFE America. "Staying Safe Online." March 11, 2004. Obtained on March 29, 2004, from <http://www.isafe.org>

Here's how you put it together:

First, give the **name of the author** or the Web site name.

➡ i-SAFE America

Then, give the **name of the article**.

➡ "Staying Safe Online"

Next comes the **date the article was written**.

➡ March 11, 2004

Finally, write in the **date you found the article** and the Web site URL on which you found it.

➡ Obtained on March 29, 2004, from <http://www.isafe.org>
