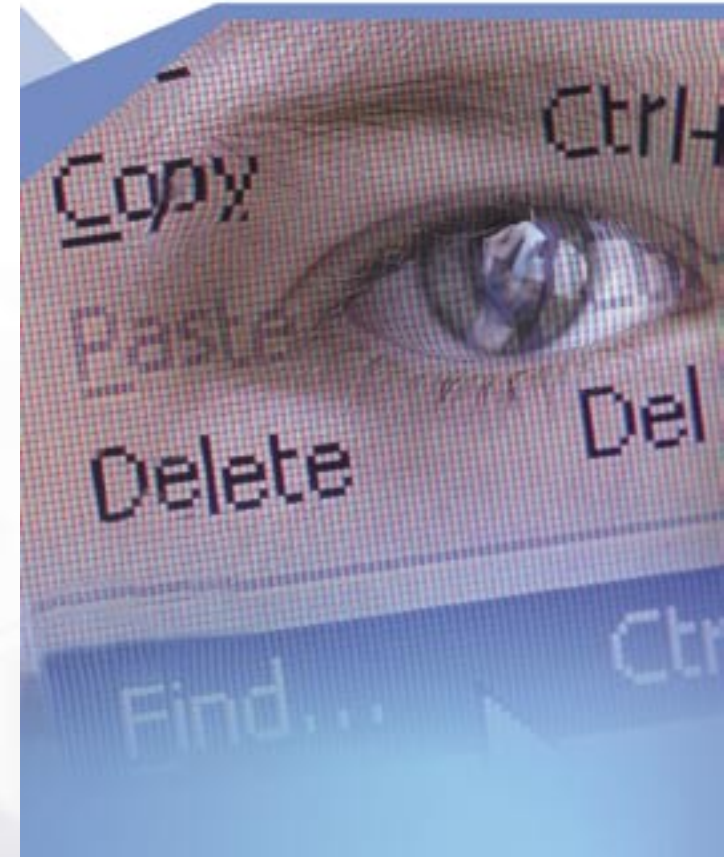

Did you know?

- 34.1 percent of students say the main way they keep in touch with friends is through e-mail, instant messaging, or chat rooms.
- 29.2 percent of students have given out personal information (name, sex, age) over the Internet.
- 24.3 percent of students are online an average of more than an hour everyday.



BRIDGING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE

In a recent i-SAFE survey, 93.2 percent of parents said they had established rules for their children’s Internet activity. The same survey revealed more than a third of students said their parents had NOT established rules for Internet activity. i-SAFE is here to help reverse this trend and prevent our children from being forever lost in the chasm that is the Digital Divide.



- 24 percent of students say they do not feel safe on the Internet.
- 25 percent of students say they have visited inappropriate places online.
- 24 percent of students say if their parents knew where they went or with whom they chatted on the Internet, they would disapprove, restrict their computer use, or take it away.

Another recent i-SAFE survey reveals more than half of parents feel their ability to monitor and shelter their kids from inappropriate material is limited. However, it does not have to be this way.

i-SAFE will provide you with the tools and training needed to keep everyone in your community safe. And remember: You don’t have to be a computer expert; you only have to care about the safety of your child. THE NEW P2P — COMMUNITY MESSAGE SHARING

The FBI states that child pornography and the sexual exploitation of children through online means is the most significant crime problem it faces today. A recent survey conducted by the i-SAFE **National Assessment Center (NAC)** reveals that more than half of students prefer to be alone when online. And whether they prefer it, many kids do not have a choice, because both parents are working hard to provide them with computers and other tools to help them reach the future they deserve. Parents cannot do it alone. They need the help of the community.

- 24 percent of students see nothing wrong with chatting with strangers on the Internet (2003-04 survey).
- 37 percent of students trust those with whom they chat online.
- 28 percent of students have seen something on the Internet that they consider dangerous.
- 81.9 percent of students say kids and teens need to learn Internet safety.

i-SAFE has many different ways for you to help.

i-PARENT Board: Comprised of a group of dedicated adults seeking to educate others about Internet safety, i-PARENT Boards advocate the implementation of i-SAFE curriculum into their local schools. i-PARENT Board activities can range from distributing Internet safety tip sheets and conducting i-PARENT Programs for local organizations, to implementing the i-Adopt-A-School Program.

i-Adopt-a-School: As a Congressionally funded nonprofit foundation, i-SAFE’s financial resources are modest. To meet the needs of individual schools, i-SAFE partners with local organizations to financially sponsor the implementation of i-SAFE Internet safety education into a single school.
